TRAINING AND LABOR INCLUSION
THROUGH ETHICAL, INTERCULTURAL AND
SOCIAL FASHION

The European project “**Fashion for Inclusion. Training and labor inclusion through ethical, intercultural and social fashion**”, coordinated by [Asociación Bienestar y Desarrollo](#) and financed by the Spanish National Agency ERASMUS+ SEPIE, begins its journey.

The Fashion for Inclusion project will be carried out until **February 2023** and aims to foster the social and labor inclusion of migrants and refugees at a European level, boosting their access to Vocational Education and Training (VET) in the field of sewing, clothing recycling, fashion and design.

The **Fashion for Inclusion** project will **design, implement and evaluate a common training program on sewing, clothing recycling, fashion and design**, aimed at trainers and professionals in the field of sustainable fashion who want or are working with migrants and/or people at risk of social exclusion.

Different actions will be implemented such as international meetings, national seminars, international short-term staff training events, 15 local workshops (in Barcelona, Bologna, Athens, Brussels, Madrid) and a network with key stakeholders and public authorities that will culminate with national and international dissemination events. Moreover, a European awareness dissemination campaign will be launched on social media reaching the general public.

Throughout the project, more than **400 VET professionals** will be involved in the training increasing their career development and knowledge in a sustainable fashion with an intercultural perspective, and **135 immigrants and refugees** in vulnerable situations will participate in the training program, boosting their access to high-quality education and their labor inclusion.
